
INSTANTLY KILLED

Miss Nora Gorman Struck by
Engine at Granite St.

Irregular Scalp Wound on Back
of Head and Neck Broken.

Accident Due to Her Own Carelessness
in Trying to Cross Tracks.

August 10, 1896

Woman Killed by the Cars.—Mrs. Honora McAlrea, a woman fifty-two years of age, was killed last night by the cars, about five o'clock, not far above the passenger station. A train of a few nearly empty wood-cars was standing just above the crossing, and she was on the side next the canal taking chips from the rear car. She attempted to cross the track above the train, when it started, knocking her down and one or two wheels passed over her body, badly crushing but not seriously mutilating it. The wheels were pried up and she was taken out and carried to her home, No. 41, rear of Park street, dying soon after reaching it. She worked in the mill and lived alone, her husband being dead. She has several children all of whom are married and some live in this city.
